


Year 6 Untold Stories Overview

<p style="text-align: center;">Cross Curricular Links</p>	<p>Links to our History Topic: We are going to learn how the Kingdom of Benin began and how it grew in success and the threats it faced. We are going to learn what life was like for the Edo people in Benin. We are going to be learning the stories of four rulers of Benin, the word for ruler is Oba. Their names are: Oba Ewuare, Oba Ozolua, Oba Esigie and Oba Orhgbua,</p>	<p>Links to our Science Topic: We will learn about scientists and paleontologists whose work and discoveries have contributed to our knowledge and understanding of evolution and inheritance. Their names are Charles Darwin, Alfred Russel Wallace, Mary Anning and Dong Zhiming.</p>	<p>Other curriculum links: In our music assemblies, we will learn the untold stories of musicians and performers from all over the world.</p> <p>In art we will look at the incredible artwork from Benin, as well as a variety of contemporary African artists including Esther Mahlangu and Cheri Samba.</p>
